Best Practices in Women's Health: Focus on American Indian/Alaska Native Women's Health Conference

By the end of the training, participants will have learned to:

- Identify screening, prevention, and treatment options for women with substance use and other behavioral health concerns and provide an opportunity to obtain a buprenorphine prescription waiver
- Recognize the principles of women's and neonatal health care optimally practiced in rural and sometimes remote settings, such as those served by Indian Health Service, Tribal, and Urban health programs
- Promote prevention of birth defects, enhance disease prevention/health maintenance, and encourage early diagnosis and culturally sensitive clinical and systems intervention strategies in the assessment and treatment of women and neonates in Level I hospitals, low risk maternity units, or ambulatory health centers
- Identify high-risk women and neonates who would best be managed in larger secondary or tertiary care centers as part of a formalized regional perinatal and gynecologic consultation, referral, and clinical care program
- Utilize IHS, tribal and state systems for improved delivery of clinical women's and child health care

ALSO PROVIDER COURSE

Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO) is an evidence-based, interprofessional, and multidisciplinary training program that equips the entire maternity care team with skills to effectively manage obstetric emergencies. This comprehensive course encourages a standardized team-based approach amongst physicians, residents, nurse midwives, registered nurses and other members of the maternity care team to improve patient safety and positively impact maternal outcomes.
