**Maternal Mortality Review Committees vary across states as to:** Whether they are permanently established by statute; authority to access records; how often they meet; how often they publish reports and whether they develop actionable recommendations to prevent future deaths; whether they use a common data system or varying ones; their reliance on volunteers instead of designated/authorized members; and their funding.

**Implementing MMRC:** In 2018, six states (Connecticut, Kansas, Kentucky, Indiana, Pennsylvania, Oregon) and the District of Columbia passed legislation establishing an MMRC; they are in varying stages of standing-up their Committees. **As of August 2019**, an additional 14 states (Arkansas, Colorado, Idaho, Missouri, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Virginia and Washington) passed legislation to set-up, formally authorize or reconstitute an MMRC.

**Current AIM State:** The Alliance for Innovation on Maternal Health (AIM) Program is a national partnership of organizations including ACOG that provides evidence-based patient safety and quality improvement resources to states and birthing facilities to reduce maternal morbidity and mortality. AIM started by supporting select states with the highest rates of maternal mortality and morbidity. These states were chosen based on three priority criteria: (1) an established maternal mortality review committee; (2) capacity to collect data and sustain the AIM data infrastructure; and (3) an established, multidisciplinary, state-led body to coordinate the AIM statewide quality improvement initiative. The original AIM states are: CA, FL, IL, LA, MD, MI, MS, NJ, OK, and UT.
